HAW STUDENT ASSESSMENT AT A GLANCE

Istation

- We will continue to monitor your child's progress using Istation's Indicators of Progress (ISIP) for literacy and math. ISIP is a computer-adaptive assessment that is completed monthly. Your child receives items based on his or her individual ability. Every item presented is based on the response to the previous item. The purpose is not to give your child a score or grade but to determine how to best support their learning. ISIP generates reports that show your child's progress and identify instructional needs. With the information from these reports, teachers are able to determine the next steps for instruction. Teachers will share ISIP results with parents throughout the year.
- Students have started completing the ISIP assessment for August.
- ISIP will be completed the beginning of each month.
- WIDA Kindergarten Screener
 - WIDA Screener for Kindergarten is an individually administered paper-and-pencil test that helps educators identify students as English learners (ELs). During registration parents with Kindergarten students or students new to New Mexico complete a Language Use Survey. The results of this survey indicate if students need to be screened. If students qualify as an English Language Learner, English Language Development (ELD) services are offered and students take the ACCESS assessment in the Spring. Currently the WIDA is being administered as appropriate and parents will be notified of the results.
